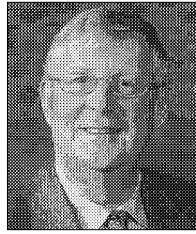

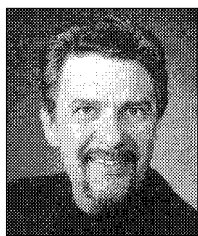

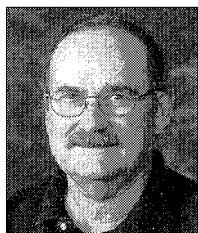
5. Do not have a snack before going to a party in an effort to control your eating. The whole point of going to a Christmas party is to eat other people's food for free. Lots of it. Hello?

## Board Minutes, 11/01/05

Meeting called to order 6:40 PM by Tom Cooke. Officers present were Craig Anderson, Amy Boehme, Billy Goldfoos, Jim Streatly, Tim Harden, and Jay Sousa. Also present were newly elected board members Jerry Johnson, Bruce Fultz, and Ed Dietz. Minutes from the October general membership meeting were read and accepted.

### Reports:

House Captain, Craig Anderson – Repairs are still needed to the roof. Water spots are evident in some areas. A temporary patch is planned for now. Tom Cooke to get in touch with MID for an action plan. We also need to repaint the house and expect the cost to be \$150 to \$200 for paint. The sprinkler system is working better now. Some tools were purchased (a rake) and some winter house supplies. Motion was made to approve temporary patch repairs to the roof (M/S/P).

Cruising and Social Captain, Billy Goldfoos – The end of season party was a success. Thanks Jim Streatly and others for their help. Christmas Party to be held at the clubhouse on Saturday, Dec. 3rd. Prime rib dinner is planned.

Dock Captain, Tim Harden – The floating docks have been moved to prevent damage. Targeting end of November to begin dock work if the water levels cooperate.

Secretary, Scott Foster – The membership handbooks are printed. The handbooks, the Savemart S.H.A.R.E.S. cards, and new PICYA cards are going to be sent to members as soon as possible.

Treasurer, Amy Boehme – Dock and General account balance were reported.

### New Business:

There will be a discussion and final vote on usage and fees for dry sailing slips held at the December 13 membership meeting. Also to be discussed will be membership's approval of next year's budget. If you are interested in these im-

portant club issues please attend the meetings.

Recommendations for use of dry sailing slips was presented by committee. Motion was made to accept recommendations with amendment to charge \$100 per space for non-season use October through February (M/S/P).

Income from use of dry sailing slips over next year's active sailing season, March through September, was conservatively estimated at \$1800 (10 boats @\$180 each). This amount was added to the budget as a separate line item.

After review and discussion of budget particulars a motion was presented to accept the budget as proposed with an amendment to add the \$1800 income for dry sailing slips leaving a balanced budget with a \$64 surplus for 2006. The budget is to be reviewed again in March and in June for updates (M/S/P).

### Good of the Order:

A special thanks to all that helped with the end of season party, especially Craig Anderson, Jim Streatly, Billy Goldfoos, Ed Dietz, and Matt Loeffler. Also a special thanks to Amy Boehme for preparing the budget.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50 PM.

## Membership Minutes, 11/08/05

Meeting called to order 7:05 PM by Brigitte Loeffler. All officers present. Minutes from the Nov. 1 board meeting were read and accepted.

### Old Business:

Amy presented the budget that was drafted and approved at the Nov. 1 board meeting. A copy was posted for members to review. The budget would receive final approval by vote of the membership later during the meeting. The 2006 budget was balanced with historical revenue and expense data with no increases in dock fees or membership dues. Our current financial status will allow for full dock expansion and significant maintenance work. It will also allow purchase of a decent race committee boat, and money for house repairs.

Wes Unruh suggested the fundraiser income from the special events the club holds be removed as income producers in the budget. Instead the funds raised could be used for specific projects as needed. After some discussion it was decided to let next year's board consider it.

The committee that was formed to establish a dry sailing program presented a final draft of their recommendations to the membership. Basically, the parking spaces in front of the white fence line and the areas in front of the storage shed and garage are slotted to accommodate up to 15 vessels on trailers. Guidelines and rules will soon be posted. Discussion to have an entity or entities responsible for administering the program was had.

Votes were tallied regarding up to \$6,000 be allotted for a race committee boat. All proxy votes were counted and those present at the meeting were also allowed to vote if they had not sent in a proxy card. The motion was approved with a total of 26 votes, 16 for and 10 against.

At 7:30 a 10 minute recess was held to allow any that had not had a chance to review the budget to do so. Motion to approve the budget as presented (M/S/P).

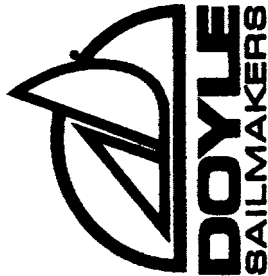
